


**TOWN OF WALDHEIM
BYLAW NO. 01-2005**

**A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF WALDHEIM, IN THE PROVINCE OF
SASKATCHEWAN, TO REGULATE OR PROHIBIT EXCESSIVE NOISE
& THE BEING AT LARGE OF DOMESTIC PETS WITHIN THE TOWN**

The Council of the Town of Waldheim, in the Province of Saskatchewan pursuant to Sections 128(a) and 135(1)(f) of The Urban Municipality Act, 1984, enacts as follows:

- 1) Interpretation:
 - a) "Town" means the Town of Waldheim
 - b) "Domestic Pet(s)" means any and all breeds of domesticated cats and/or dogs identified by the wearing of a collar.
 - c) "Excessive Noise" means any and all sources of noise from domestic pet(s), that is found to be unnecessary or unreasonable, including but not limited to continuous barking of a dog.
 - d) "Owner" means any resident of the Town who owns, keeps, possesses or harbours a domestic pet.
- 2) No person shall allow their domestic pet(s) to be at large within the Town without being restrained by a leash or harness. Owners should ensure that their domestic pet(s) remains on their property by either the means of a leash, harness or adequate enclosure.
- 3) No person shall allow their domestic pet(s) to cause excessive noise within the Town.
- 4) Where the owner of a domestic pet, that has been reported to the Town office of being at large and unrestrained &/or of causing excessive noise, has been identified the following procedures will be followed:
 - (a) For the first offence, the owner will be sent a letter from the Town informing them that their domestic pet(s) has been reported to the Town of being at large &/or causing excessive noise and that they are in non-compliance with the Town Bylaw and are liable to a fine of not less than twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars and warned that they will be liable to a fine of not less than fifty (\$50.00) dollars for the second offence and not less than one hundred (\$100.00) dollars for any third and subsequent offence.
 - (b) For the second offence, the owner will receive a second letter and will be liable to a fine of not less than fifty (\$50.00) dollars.
 - (c) For any third and subsequent offence, the owner will receive a letter and will be liable to a fine of not less than less than one hundred (\$100.00) dollars.
- 5) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this bylaw is guilty of an offence and is liable to a fine.
- 6) This bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the day of the third reading and adoption.
- 7) Bylaw No. 2-2001 is hereby repealed.


